

Indoor Protocols effective on May 15<sup>th</sup> at PSA McKinney, PSA2 and PSA Murphy. Effective May 17<sup>th</sup> at PSA1:

- **Masks**

- Required of all people entering the buildings
- Masks must cover mouth and nose.
- Required of all spectators and coaches while in the building "at all times"
- Not required of officials and players on the court/field. They can wear them if they desire.
- Failure to wear a mask by coaches or spectators can result in a technical foul
- Required after completion of play on all officials and players
- Must be wearing masks while exiting the buildings

- **Temperature testing will be done at entrance to the facilities**

- **Spectators**

- Maximum of two spectators per player at games and they must enter together. A coach on the bench does not count as a spectator
  - The two spectators will sit next to each other on the x's marked while maintaining social distancing.
  - One of the spectators may be under 16 but MUST sit with parent. No running in the facility and no touching of PSA equipment. No getting on the court/field. The under 16 spectator must be with parent at all times.
- Seating will be on marked bleachers or bring your own chair.
- Keep your hands and equipment disinfected. PSA maintains disinfectant throughout the building
- No spectators at practices
- All spectators masked at all times in the building.

- **Entrances** – two will be maintained at each building so congestion is not created

Violation of mask protocols by coaches or spectators can result in technical fouls and/or forfeiture.

Our goal is to minimize the traffic and congestion to reduce the risk of infection.

PSA1 lobby will remain closed until at least June.

Camps protocols are coming but will be very similar to indoor league play.

It is looking better in Collin County and should it improve further we will look at masks before the end of the summer.

Outdoor Spring protocols remain until the end of the Spring season and then will be reevaluated
